Introducing Hope To You!

(This testimony was written in November of 2007 by Vicki)

Things at work seemed to go from bad to worse. My self-confidence diminished, and I felt I was being personally attacked because of my lack of education. If that wasn't bad enough, other things in my personal life were knocking me down, pushing me into despair. Looking at my life, I honestly felt like I had no hope. Then, one day on my lunch hour, I decided I had to put some hope back in my life. I felt the Lord leading me to get something tangible to keep in front of me as a constant reminder that I do have hope.

So, I went to the Dollar Store and began looking around. That's when I spotted her — a little 7" stuffed rabbit dressed in a green and white print outfit with matching ears. She had a small silver cord attached to the back of her head, perfect for hanging in my work cubicle. Naming her Hope, I rescued her from her uselessness on that store shelf, paid my dollar plus tax, and took her back to my office. Using a push pin, I hung her in a prominent spot in my cubicle so that every time I saw her, I would be reminded that I do have hope, no matter how I feel.

You may think it's silly, but Hope has gone with me on several jobs. I don't worship her; she's not a security blanket; she never says a word; she just sits on my desk with her nose partway ripped off, reminding me that no matter how bad I



feel, no matter what the circumstances, or no matter how hopeless a situation may seem, I still have hope.

What a great testimony Vicki wrote over two years ago. Her faith is inspiring to hundreds who read her writings.

Today, Vicki sits in her special chair that helps her to get up. Whenever she has a need to go anywhere, she must go by wheelchair because she is not able to walk. The doctors are giving her little hope of a long life. Vicki has been diagnosed with Kidney Cancer. The cancer has progressed to the fourth stage, and surgery is impossible. There is an 11 centimeter tumor rooted in her kidney. In addition, several other tumors are located in the lower pelvic area. One is constantly pushing against a nerve which causes her extreme pain in her right leg, along with numbness in her foot. Another tumor has eaten away at the pelvic bone which has caused a great concern that the bone might break. The doctor said there are several tumors in her lungs as well. Another one was also found in the lymph node between her lungs.

It's times like this that test your faith as it has never been tested before. Especially, when it is Christmas, and everyone else is having a good time.

Christmas this year would prove to be one of the most memorable and yet, trying, times of our lives. To be honest, we were not going to have a Christmas tree. All the family

gathered when the unwanted news came. Someone said, "Let's put up a Christmas tree." The old tree was in bad shape last year and we threw it away. So off to Walmart we went to buy a new one. We had a blast putting up this 32" tree, and when everything was in place, we realized we did not have a star. Someone volunteered to go back to the store, but a thought came to me so clear . . .

Little HOPE, the rag doll that looked like a rabbit would look good on the tree this year.

So — with a bow on her head, we fastened her to the top branch. The tree is located just across from Vicki's special chair where she can look up and remember there is *hope* in Jesus. I watch her sometimes, and I see hope in her eyes as she struggles through each day.

Vicki now has gone through several radiation treatments, believing God for good results. Our faith is in the unseen hand of Jesus, of whom, we have seen hundreds of miracles manifested through this ministry. Faith In Motion Ministries must go on, and we must always know that Jesus is the total answer. Somehow, someday, God will come through, and Vicki Campbell will continue to be a blessing to hundreds with her teachings and her writings. Cancer is just a name! The Bible says concerning Jesus' name . . . *Every knee will bow, and every tongue confess, Jesus Christ is Lord* (Phil. 2:11).

Yet, it was just one of those nagging thoughts that just popped into my mind every now and then as I made all of the necessary preparations; you know, like shots and packing plenty of non-perishable American food.

It was an exciting time full of new experiences. I felt like a rich lady when I exchanged \$100 for about 60,000 Bolivars. However, I was a little nervous about flying in a small foreign propeller plane with a stewardess giving instructions in Spanish. Yet, it was worth it to arrive at an airport where the same man that guided the plane down the runway would also be the one to unload our luggage and perform the baggage claim. Then, before we could get out of the parking lot, he would turn off all the lights and close the airport.

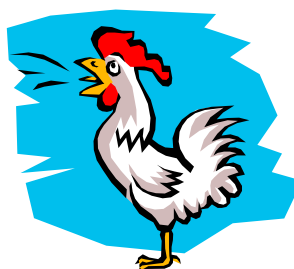
Before I knew it, our driver delivered us to the church where the street was full of people awaiting our arrival. What a welcoming committee! I may not have known what they were saying, but the hugs and smiles said it all. Not only did they offer us their friendship, they had a meal prepared for us even though it was 11:00 p.m.

When we finally settled down in our room, I was exhausted and just knew that I would be asleep as soon as my head hit the pillow. Bill did, but not me. Oh, no. I guess it was all the excitement of the day — at least it started out that way. Then, the crowing started. At first, I thought I was hearing things. After all, we were in the middle of the city, and it was 2:00 a.m. and pitch black outside. I didn't even know if they had roosters in Venezuela, but I was sure it couldn't be a rooster I was hearing, especially not here or now.

Then, it hit me. The local witches must have heard we were coming, and they were sitting outside putting curses on us with these strange incantations. It had to be. After all, the crowing continued non-stop. Even if by some teensy-weensy chance there were roosters outside, they sure wouldn't carry on like this.

Suddenly, I was afraid. Here I was in a foreign country with these witches outside. What if they were waiting until morning to torture us? . . . or kill us? Knowing my imagination was getting carried away, I insisted that I get a hold of myself. Taking a few deep breaths in hopes of slowing my heart rate and lowering my blood pressure, I began praying and doing

spiritual warfare, quietly of course — I didn't want to wake up the others in the house. I knew *greater was He that was within me* than those witches outside. With as much boldness as I could muster up, I quoted scriptures, rebuked, and pled the blood until the crowing finally ceased, and I drifted off to sleep for a few short hours.



When I woke up, I was still a little shook up, but took a cold shower and joined the others outside as we waited for breakfast. While making small talk, imagine my surprise when a cocky rooster came strutting his stuff right up to us as though he was giving us the *what-for* for invading his territory. I couldn't believe it! I actually spent hours during the night trying to cast out a rooster. I didn't know whether to be mad or relieved.

At that moment, I could somehow relate to Jesse Duplantis, who tells his story about spending the night rebuking and casting out a fluttering shadow in his motel room to only find out come morning that it was his raincoat hanging in the corner. The outside light had filtered through the blinds causing an illusion that a ghost was flying around his room.

God has His way of teaching us lessons we'll never forget. He used this humorous way of showing me I wasn't as spiritually-minded as I thought I was. I still had a lot to learn about discernment, and yes, pride, because for a long time, I was too embarrassed to let anyone know that I tried to cast out a rooster.

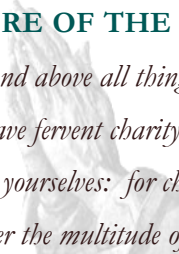
